

Ultrasound Fellowship Application Guide

Stepwise Approach

1. Make an account on the SCUF (Society for Clinical Ultrasound Fellowships) website. This is your home base for your EUS (Emergency Ultrasound) application. See link below:

2. Fill out your application - this is mostly easy demographic stuff EXCEPT:
 - a. **THREE** Letters of Recommendation (1 has to be from PD Parikh)
 - b. Personal Statement
 - c. CV
3. **DEADLINES** - There are no obvious or clear deadlines for application submission by any specific program (in my experience). However, the NRMP has a very clear set of deadlines for this year's match which can be viewed below:

I recommend that you have your ENTIRE application ready to go no later than **September 1st**. To be honest, you will probably get interviews at most places you apply to especially if you apply early. I missed out on an interview because they didn't have enough spots left because I didn't apply until late September. Once your application is filled out, LORs are uploaded, CV and PS are uploaded, you literally just pay and submit your applications through the SCUF (now called eusfellowships) website.
4. Register for the match on NRMP website, rank your programs and voila! You are now and Ultrasound Fellow.

TLDR: Fill out an application on SCUF website. 3 LORs, CV and PS. Submit applications by September 1st.
